The Rocks Will Cry Out – Luke 19:28–42

CONNECT:

- In the midst of these unusual times, what has occurred in the past week that has been an encouragement to you?

GROW:

- Read Luke 19:28–42. Why are people excited (see 2 Samuel 16:2 and Zechariah 9:9) as Jesus makes His way to Jerusalem on a donkey? What are their hopes and expectations?
- Why did Jesus weep in this moment when He is receiving so much glory and attention?
- Why was it right for the Jews to long to be free from Roman oppression? Why is it right for us to long for an end to the COVID-19 outbreak? How does Luke 18:39-42 help us understand what we can do when we have struggles or concerns? Why is it wrong, though, for these things to become our *highest* longings (see Luke 19:41–42; 2 Corinthians 4:17–18)?
- What are some things Jesus teaches us about His Kingdom (see John 18:36; Matthew 13:31–32; Matthew 13:36–43; Matthew 13:44; Philippians 3:21)?
- Read Hebrews 12:22–29 and list the wonderful truths you see in this passage about the Kingdom of God.

GO:

- In what ways is His church an outpost on earth of Jesus' Kingdom? In these times, what are specific ways that we, as a Church, can give our neighbors a glimpse of the Kingdom of God this week?
