*A God Worthy of Our Trust* – Habakkuk 1:12—2:1

### CONNECT:

- Are there circumstances in the world right now, or even in your own life, where you are wondering where God is in it all?

### GROW:

- Read Habakkuk 1:12-2:1. What perplexing situation does Habakkuk discuss here? What makes it so perplexing? Can you relate this to something in your own life?
- Why is it important to think first in situations like this rather than just react? What attributes of God do you see in these Scriptures (not an exhaustive list by any means!)?
  - Psalm 139:4; Psalm 139:7-12; Proverbs 21:1; Psalm 62:11-12; Romans 8:28-29; Zephaniah 3:17; Habakkuk 1:12; Isaiah 6:1-5; Isaiah 6:6-7; Ephesians 1:3-14
- Why is it helpful to reflect on these attributes in situations that feel very chaotic or perplexing? Do you believe these things about God? Does your life reflect that you truly believe these things? Please explain. Which of the attributes of God from the Scriptures listed above do you most need to meditate on and incorporate?
- What do Jeremiah 17:9 and Proverbs 3:5-6 teach us about the absolute necessity of trusting God?
- What two attributes of God does Habakkuk focus on in Habakkuk 1:12? As Pastor Jeff discussed in his message, why are these attributes of God important to focus upon?

### GO:

- How does your trust in God become an effective tool for sharing the Gospel with others? Please share ideas and examples.
