

Sermon Questions for Life Groups, Individuals, and Accountability Groups — February 16, 2020

Do You Have Beautiful Feet?—Romans 10:13–16

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CONNECT:

- Do you have an example of when you were impacted by hearing good news? What was that like for you? If you are willing, please share that with the group.

GROW:

- Read Isaiah 52:7. What is the meaning of having beautiful feet, and how is good news described?
- Read Romans 10:13–17. What does it mean to call upon the name of the Lord (Acts 16:29–31; John 14:6; Acts 4:12)? What are people who call on the name of the Lord saved from (Matthew 1:21; Luke 3:7; Revelation 6:12–17; Psalm 2:12)? How good is this news?
- What do you do when you hear good news? What is the greatest news that a person can hear? Do you believe it is the greatest news? If we truly believe this is the greatest news, what should we do?
- Do you live out, and speak of, the good news of salvation in Jesus? What might stand in the way of sharing the good news? How can your life group help each other to share the good news?
- What steps can you take to keep the greatest news fresh in your mind?
- Have you ever asked someone if you could pray for them? What would be a good way to approach someone and ask that question? Roleplay this in your group. How might this lead to an opportunity to share the greatest news?

GO:

- Ask a person you see regularly if you can pray for them and what you can pray for. Who will you ask? Report back to the group about how it went the next time you meet.
