CONNECT:

• How does American culture view singleness? Marriage?

GROW:

- Read 1 Corinthians 7:1–9.
- Why does Paul say, "I wish that all were as I myself am" (see verses 6–7)? What does this teach us about Paul's overall aim in life? In what ways might marriage interfere with this aim?
- What principle does Paul emphasize as being a reason to be married? How many times is this stated in today's Bible passage? Why would be emphasize this to the Corinthian church?
- What other reasons does Scripture give for being married (see Genesis 2:18a; Genesis 1:27–28; Hebrews 13:4; Proverbs 5:15–19)?
- What does all this teach us about God's view of human sexuality? Does this surprise you? Why or why not?
- What is Paul's main point about human sexuality in 1 Corinthians 7:3–5 (see also Matthew 22:36–40)?
- In what ways does your marriage or singleness point people to Jesus? What can get in the way of your marriage or singleness pointing people to Jesus?

GO:

In order for your singleness or your marriage to point others to Jesus, what is one thing you need to set aside?
 Will you do this?
