CONNECT:

• What is your favorite style of music and why?

GROW:

- Read 1 Corinthians 8:1–13. What dilemma are the Corinthians wrestling with?
- In Corinth, what were the potential problems if a Christian was seen by others eating meat that had come from a temple where idols were worshipped?
- What do Psalm 115:4–8 and Isaiah 44:9–20 teach us about idols? What point is Paul making about this in 1 Corinthians 8?
- If the governing principle is not to be "my freedoms, my rights," what is the governing principle here that Paul is teaching (see Romans 8:15)?
- What might your marriage, or close friendships, look like if you are governed by love, rather than by your "rights and freedoms"? What "rights" might you need to set aside?
- Which of the two governing principles is "louder" in our culture? Please explain. Why do you think that is the case?
- What "rights" did Jesus set aside, and what was His governing principle in doing so (see Philippians 2:6–8)?
- What are some gray areas in the church that may be difficult to set aside?

<u>GO:</u>

• What might be an area in your own life (rights that you have) where you need to be governed more by love?
